A memorial wreath was laid by William Eiffert and John Hoellerich (WWII veterans).

Later that evening there was a dinner buffet at the hotel, hosted in the hospitality room. Door prizes were given, table decorations (provided by Myra Gregory) included an authentic sailor's cap which was given to each shipmates.
